

Aims

Objective: The investment strategy of the fund is to purchase units in the M&G PP Index-Linked Passive Fund - the underlying fund.

Underlying Fund Objective: The fund invests in UK Government index-linked gilts with over five years to maturity. The fund is passively managed against its benchmark, the iBoxx UK Gilt Inflation-Linked Over 5 Years Index. Tracking this index is achieved by fully replicating the stocks in the Index.

Performance Objective: To match the performance of the benchmark as closely as possible.


Bond Sector Breakdown




Top Country Breakdown

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Commentary

Performance as at Q1 2024 - UK index-linked government bonds (index-linked gilts) fell in the first quarter of 2024 and underperformed conventional gilts. The fall was driven by a rise in gilt yields and a fall in five-year breakeven rates. Over the period, persistent inflation led investors to scale back their expectations for interest rate cuts this year, which caused bond prices to retrace some of their gains in the previous quarter. The Bank of England maintained interest rates at 5.25% in March; however, governor Andrew Bailey said that rate cuts are “on the way” and that it was “reasonable” for financial markets to price in two or three rate cuts this year – at the start of the quarter the market had anticipated six cuts. The benchmark 10-year gilt yielded 3.9% at the end of the period, up from 3.6% three months earlier. Longer-dated gilts, particularly those over 15 years, suffered more than shorter-dated gilts. Meanwhile, breakeven rates fell over the period from 4.0% to 3.6%, indicating investor inflation expectations over five years.
