### Objectives and investment policy

**Objective:** The Fund's investment objective is to outperform the MSCI All Countries World Net Total Return Index USD (the "Benchmark") before fees per annum over rolling three year periods.

**Policy:** The Fund will invest at least 80% of its Net Asset Value in shares of companies globally, both in Developed Markets and Emerging Markets. The Fund may invest up to 25% of its Net Asset Value in Emerging Markets. The Fund invests in a moderately concentrated portfolio of global companies, which are listed on Recognised Markets, that the Investment Manager believes can create wealth for shareholders and are deemed to be transitioning to a more sustainable path, enabling the transition of others, or both. Suitable companies are identified for investment by using proprietary screening tools and analysis to rank each of the stocks in the investment universe by their potential to create shareholder wealth and the materiality and credibility of their transition plans. The Investment Manager builds the portfolio with a bias towards those companies with higher wealth creation and transition potential whilst ensuring a medium-high level of risk relative to the Benchmark. The Fund will not invest in other collective investment schemes.

The Fund may receive warrants as a result of corporate actions. No more than 5% of the Net Asset Value of the Fund will be held in warrants.

A limited amount of assets (around 5% or less) may be held in cash for efficient portfolio management (EPM) purposes and to manage the flow of investors' money in and out of the Fund.

The Fund may use derivatives (investments that derive their value from another closely related underlying investment) for EPM and hedging purposes only.

**Recommendation:** The Fund may not be appropriate for investors who plan to withdraw their money within 5 years.

### Concepts to understand

**Derivative** A financial instrument whose price is dependent upon or derived from one or more underlying asset.

**Equities** Securities that represent an ownership interest in a company.

**Efficient Portfolio Management (EPM) Techniques** The Fund may engage in EPM techniques including holdings of derivative instruments. The use of these instruments may expose the Fund to volatile investment returns and increase the volatility of the net asset value of the Fund. EPM techniques may involve the Fund entering into transactions with counterparties where there may be a risk of counterparty default. The Fund's ability to use EPM strategies may be limited by market conditions, regulatory limits and tax considerations.

*You can buy and sell your shares on each working day in London, except public holidays, at 5.00pm (Irish time) if you tell us before 5.00pm (Irish time) that you want to do so. Instructions received after 5.00pm (Irish time) will be processed at 5.00pm (Irish time) on the following working day. The Fund issues both income shares (shares in which any income is paid out to you) and accumulation shares (shares in which any income is reinvested in the Fund). Other share classes may be available as described in the Prospectus. If this is an income share class, any income will be paid out to you. If this is an accumulation share class, any income will be reinvested in the Fund.*

The fund is shown in risk category 6 because its simulated price has shown a high level of volatility historically. The SRRI was calculated using some synthetic data and may not be a reliable indication of the future risk profile. As an investment, bonds are typically more volatile than money market instruments but less volatile than shares. Bonds issued by corporations are typically more volatile than bonds issued by governments.

The risk and reward indicator is not a measure of the expected rise or fall in capital but shows how sharply the Fund's share price has gone up and down historically.

A fund whose share price has experienced sharp or large increases or decreases will sit in a higher risk category, whereas a fund whose share price has experienced small or gradual increases or decreases will sit in a lower risk category.

The indicator is calculated using a standard methodology that is used by all companies offering such funds in Europe.

The risk/reward indicator is an estimate and not a guarantee. Going forward, the Fund's actual volatility could be higher or lower, and its rated risk/reward profile could change. The lowest risk category does not mean the investment is risk free.

The risk indicator does not adequately capture the following risks, which are materially relevant to the Fund:

**Investment Risk** The value of investments and any income from them may go down as well as up and is not guaranteed. Investors may not get back the amount invested.

**Concentration risk** The price of Funds that invest in a reduced number of holdings, sectors, or geographical areas may be more heavily affected by events that influence the stock market and therefore more volatile.

**Counterparty Risk** The insolvency of any institutions providing services such as safekeeping of assets or acting as counterparty to derivatives or other instruments, may expose the Fund to financial loss.

**Emerging Markets Risk** Investing in Emerging Markets may provide greater rewards but carries greater risk due to the possibility of high volatility, low liquidity, high currency fluctuation, the adverse effect of social, political and economic instability, weak supervisory structures and weak accounting standards.

**Exchange Rate Risk** Investing in assets denominated in a currency other than the base currency of the Fund means the value of the investment can be affected by changes in exchange rates.

**Liquidity Risk** In difficult market conditions the value of certain fund investments may be less predictable than normal. In some cases this may make such investments harder to sell at the last quoted market price, or at a price considered to be fair. Such conditions could result in unpredictable changes in the value of your holding.

**Responsible Investment Style Risk** The Fund can only invest in holdings that demonstrate compliance with certain sustainable indicators or ESG characteristics. This reduces the number securities in which the Fund can invest and there may as a result be occasions where it forgoes more strongly performing investment opportunities, potentially underperforming non-sustainable funds.

**Derivative Risk** Derivatives are highly sensitive to changes in the value of the underlying asset which can increase both Fund losses and gains. The impact to the Fund can be greater where they are used in an extensive or complex manner, where the Fund could lose significantly more than the amount invested in derivatives.

## Charges

The charges you pay are used to pay the costs of running the Fund, including the costs of marketing and distributing the Fund. These charges reduce the potential growth of the investment.

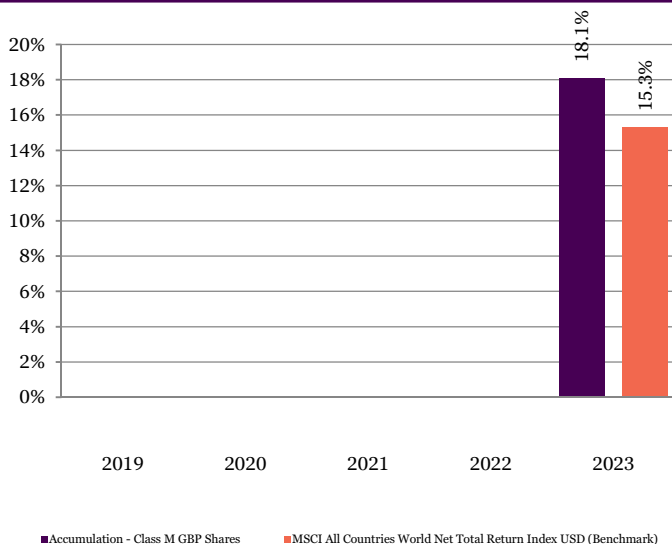
