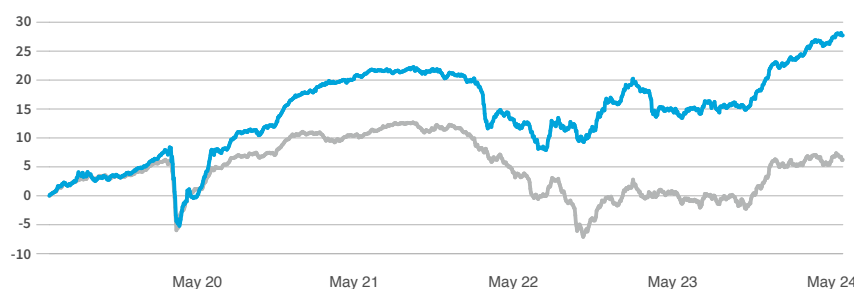

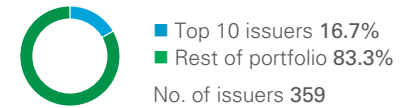

FUND MANAGERS
