What this fund does

A globally diversified fund-of-funds that allocates capital on behalf of clients and provides access to Invesco's capabilities in one fund. It is managed by Invesco's Multi-Asset Strategies (MAS) UK team which employs a robust, understandable and repeatable approach that brings together top-down asset allocation and the alpha potential of underlying investment teams. At the heart of this approach is a strong focus on fundamentals and a long-term investment horizon, which delivers a diversified mix of what the team believes are the most attractive capital growth investment opportunities across markets.

Fund objective

The Fund aims to achieve long-term (5 years plus) capital growth. The Fund invests at least 80% of its assets in collective investment schemes (including funds managed by the Invesco group) which invest in a broad range of assets including shares or other equity related securities and corporate and government debt securities (including investment grade, non-investment grade and unrated). In pursuing the Fund's investment objective, the fund manager may consider it appropriate to also invest in other transferable securities (including shares of companies), money-market instruments, other collective investment schemes (including funds managed by the Invesco group), deposits and cash.

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

Glossary

ACR/ Annual Compound Return: Compound returns represent the cumulative effect that gains and losses have on invested capital over time. Annual Compound Return is the annual rate of return that would be required for an investment to grow from its starting balance to its ending balance.

Benchmark: A standard against which an investment fund or portfolio is measured to give an indication of relative performance.

Developed markets: Countries that have more advanced economies and more mature capital markets.

Emerging markets: Countries that are in the process of developing their economies to become more advanced. Holdings: The contents of an investment portfolio or fund, including any products like equities, bonds or ETFs.

ICVC: Investment Company with Variable Capital. A type of collective investment portfolio that invests in different equities, bonds and other securities.

Index: A collection of stocks chosen to represent the performance of a particular market or sector, e.g. FTSE 100 or S&P 500.
